Orléans is a city in north-central France, located on the Loire River, about 130 kilometers southwest of Paris. It is the capital of the Centre region and belongs to the Loire Valley which was added by UNESCO to its list of World Heritage Sites.

Orléans is one hour away from Paris - Austerlitz station by train (SNCF website: www.voyages-sncf.com). There are two train stations in Orléans: "Les Aubrais" and "Orléans Centre". Once you get off the train at "Les Aubrais" or "Orléans Centre" train station, you can take the tramway to the University (direction "Hôpital de la Source": TAO website <http://www.reseau-tao.fr/>). It takes approximately half an hour from the station "Orléans centre" and less than 45 minutes from the station "Les Aubrais" to get to the University: get off the tramway at the "Université-Château" stop.
